Lisa Hanson Named to ACNM Fellowship

In 1992, Dr. Hanson co-founded the Marquette University Nurse-Midwifery Education Program. She has been a leader in distance education, using an evidence-based approach, and received the A.C.N.M. Foundation Excellence in Teaching Award three times.

Dr. Hanson currently serves on the Division of Research Governing Board and is the Chair of the Dissemination and Development Section. She is an active researcher and author and serves on the International Confederation of Midwives Research Advisory Network. She is the immediate past-Chair of the ACNM Wisconsin Chapter and is active in legislative matters that impact women's access to CNM care in Wisconsin. Lisa also served on the ACNM Certification Council test construction committee. She is a peer-reviewer for the *Journal of Midwifery and Women's Health* and for the *Journal of Obstetric, Gynecologic and Neonatal Nursing*.
