## **Jacquelynn Tillett Named to ACNM Fellowship**

**SILVER SPRING, MD - Jacquelynn Tillett CNM, PhD, FACNM**, was inducted into the Fellowship of the American College of Nurse-Midwives (FACNM) at the ACNM's 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting in Chicago, Illinois, this May.

Jacquelynn Tillett completed her midwifery education in 1987 and her Doctor of Nursing degree in 1994, both at Rush University College of Nursing in Chicago. She is Director of the Midwifery and Wellness Center affiliated with Aurora Sinai Medical Center in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and is an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health. She mentors her staff to serve on committees and working groups throughout the hospital and the State and has made public service part of staff evaluation. Jackie serves on the Board of the Wisconsin Association for Perinatal Care, the Wisconsin Maternal Mortality Review Board, and the Board of the Aurora/University of Wisconsin Medical Group.

Jackie has worked with the Quality Management Section of the Division of Standards and Practice since 1995, serving as Chair since 2001. She edited the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> editions of the ACNM handbook *Quality Management* and wrote the chapter on quality improvement. She was instrumental in the development of the ACNM Benchmarking Project and its further dissemination.

Dr. Tillett is a reviewer for the *Journal of Midwifery and Women's Health* and for *MCN, the Journal of Maternal Child Nursing* and serves as Associate Editor for the *Journal of Perinatal and Neonatal Nursing*.

Fellowship in the American College of Nurse-Midwives (FACNM) is an honor bestowed upon those midwives whose demonstrated leadership, clinical excellence, outstanding scholarship, and professional achievement have merited special recognition both within and outside the midwifery profession.
