

2011 ACNM Benchmarking Project:

Summary Data – Preliminary Report

For the 2011 calendar year data reporting cycle, 203 practices submitted data that was considered valid for consideration. This represents a 48% increase in participation from the 2010 calendar year reporting cycle, and is a record high in terms of the absolute number of practices participating. Ninety-seven practices participated for the first time ever.

The aggregate data reported included a total of 83,400 births and the work of nearly 900 certified nurse-midwife/certified midwife (CNM/CM) FTEs. Included in the work of these CNMs/CMs were the following:

- Over 69,000 vaginal births
- 2,859 trials of labor after cesarean (TOLAC), with an average vaginal birth after cesarean (VBAC) success rate of 73.1%
- Approximately 2,000 homebirths
- Approximately 4,500 birth center births (32% of which occurred in American Association of Birth Centers accredited centers)
- Over 75,000 hospital births
- An estimated \$250 million dollars in billed care
- Over \$75 million in provider salaries

Any practice with a minimum of one CNM/CM was eligible to participate in the data submission process. Participating practices represented a variety of geographic areas:

- Forty-three states and/or US territories are represented (including Guam and Puerto Rico).
- States not represented were Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Kentucky, Mississippi, Nevada, North Dakota, and South Carolina.
- Practice location varied between rural (22%), metropolitan (30%), and urban (48%)
- ACNM Regional participation:
 - o Region I 22 practices
 - o Region II 30 practices
 - o Region III 18 practices
 - o Region IV 42 practices

- o Region V 64 practices
- Region VI 27 practices
- The states with the highest participation were:
 - o Texas 24 practices
 - o New York 17 practices
 - o Massachusetts and North Carolina 10 practices each
 - Colorado and Wisconsin 9 practices each

Additionally, a wide demographic of practice types were represented:

- Independent, midwife-led practices (68%)
- Shared practice models with exclusive midwifery caseloads (18%)
- Combined practice models with physicians (11%)
- Additionally, CNM-LM partnerships, CNM-CPM partnerships, laborist/hospitalist services, and resident supervision models were also represented (<1%)

When classified by the total number of births per year, a variety of practice sizes were evident:

- 59 large-sized practices (>500 births/yr)
- 61 medium-sized practices (200 499 births/yr)
- 83 small-sized practices (≤ 199 births/yr)

Participating practices were surveyed regarding their PRIMARY payor type. Results were as follows:

- 39% Medicaid
- 32% private insurance
- 16% equal mix of two or more payor types
- 10% self-pay
- 3% managed-care

The breakdown of primary practice sites were as follows:

- 42% community-based hospitals
- 34% tertiary care hospitals
- 17% homebirth
- 7% birth center

73.5% of the reporting practices indicated that they do provide trial of labor after cesarean (TOLAC).
