Terri Patrice Clark Named to ACNM Fellowship

Dr. Clark graduated from Yale College, Yale University in 1976. In 1979 she obtained her midwifery and MSN at Yale University School of Nursing (YSN). She has a PhD from the University of California, San Diego. While on the midwifery faculty at YSN, Dr. Clark developed an international midwifery collaborative in South Africa and precepted YSN midwifery students there. Dr. Clark is presently an Associate Professor at Seattle University. Her academic passions include ethics, global health, labor and birth, newborns and care of people with HIV and she has presented many ACNM workshops and educational programs. She has done volunteer work as a midwife in Mexico, Haiti, and Cambodia. Dr. Clarks is on the Board of Directors of Code Blue Now! and Circle of Health International.

Dr. Clark served as a peer reviewer and as Associate Editor of the *Journal of Nurse-Midwifery* and as an Editorial Consultant for the *Journal of Midwifery & Women's Health*. For the ACNM, she served on the HIV Task Force, the Education Committee, Interorganizational Affairs Committee, and the Ad Hoc Committee to Develop a Code of Ethics. Currently, she serves on the International Health Committee, the Division of Research, and the President's Task Force on the Role of Midwifery in Healthcare Reform. She also serves on the Certificate Maintenance Committee of the American Midwifery Certification Board and has been Chair of two Chapters of ACNM.
