Today, she serves as chair of the ACNM State Affiliate Development and Support Subcommittee; member of the ACNM Bylaws Committee; lowa Nurses' Association Public Policy Committee; and the Iowa Board of Nursing Nurse-Midwifery Committee. Himmelreich also played an integral role in recruiting and retaining military midwives to ACNM, and served as a board liaison for them.

Himmelreich received her nursing diploma from the St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing and earned her master's in public health and midwifery education at Boston University.
