Cara Krulewitch Named to ACNM Fellowship

Silver Spring, MD – Cara Krulewitch, CNM, PhD, FACNM of Derwood, MD was inducted into the Fellowship of the American College of Nurse-Midwives (FACNM) at the ACNM 53rd Annual Meeting in Boston this May.

Dr. Krulewitch earned her B.S. in biology, 1976; RN, 1978; M.S. in perinatal nursing, 1984; PhD in perinatal epidemiology, 1992; and obtained her midwifery in 1997 from the State University of New York Stony Brook. In 1993, as a CDC Maternal Child Health Epidemiologist assigned to the District of Columbia Health Department, Dr. Krulewitch began her research on enhanced maternal mortality surveillance and discovered a relationship between pregnancy and intimate partner homicide. She published and presented widely on this critical issue and received a number of awards including the 2001 Journal Article of the Year from the *Journal of Midwifery & Women's Health (JMWH)*. The health care policy discussion spurred by her research culminated in the Safe Motherhood Act and the Unborn Victims of Violence Act of 2001.

Currently she is an epidemiologist at the FDA Center for Devices and Radiological Health. Dr. Krulewitch was on the Advisory Board of the ACNM Division of Research (DOR). She has been an Editorial Board member and consultant for the *JMWH*, served as a Section Chair in the DOR and in the Division of Women's Health Policy and Leadership, was elected to serve on the ACNM Nominating Committee, and is the treasurer of the American Midwifery Certification Board.
